PRE-CAMP CHECK IN

 June 23 at 5p in the Family Center; please bring all luggage and medications to check in to expedite the morning of process (All carry on items will be brought onto the bus with students, so no need to bring them to this check in!)

DEPARTURE

Please Arrive at MISSION by 730a Friday, June 24. We will be in the Family Center where
every camper will be checked in and hang out with their leader (Parents are required to
come inside to check in their child; please no drop-offs). There will be a pre-departure
address to parents and preteens, but this process will be quick, so please be on time!

CAMP RULES

WE HAVE FOUR BASIC RULES FOR CAMP:

- RESPECT CAMP PROPERTY LET'S LEAVE THE CAMPUS BETTER THAN WE FOUND IT.
- RESPECT THE LEADERS YOUR LEADER AND ALL OTHER ADULTS LEADING AT CAMP.
- RESPECT YOUR PEERS HELP MAKE THE WEEK FUN FOR EVERYONE.
 - EX: NO PRANKS; REALLY NO PRANKING
- NO GUYS OR GALS ALLOWED IN CABINS DESIGNATED FOR THE OTHER GENDER. ALSO, NO ONE GOES ALONE... ALWAYS BE WITH A BUDDY FROM YOUR GROUP.

WE ALSO HAVE 3 MANDATORY EXPERIENCES FOR EVERY CAMPER:

- MEETINGS CAMPERS MUST ATTEND ALL MEETINGS/SESSIONS ON THE SCHEDULE.
- MEDS CAMPERS WITH MEDS MUST TAKE REQUIRED DOSES AT REQUIRED TIMES.
- MEALS YOU GOTTA EAT! THERE ARE PLENTY OF OPTIONS.

WHILE WE WANT EVERY CAMPER TO FULLY ENJOY HIS/HER EXPERIENCE WHILE AT CAMP, OCCASIONALLY WE HAVE TO ENFORCE CONSEQUENCES WHEN CAMPERS PUSH THE BOUNDARIES OF THESE RULES.

CAMPERS WHO BREAK THESE RULES WILL FACE THE FOLLOWING:

- FIRST OFFENSE WARNING: EVERYONE DESERVES A SECOND CHANCE.
- SECOND OFFENSE CAMPER WILL SIT OUT FROM THAT SPECIFIC ACTIVITY.
- THIRD OFFENSE PARENTS WILL BE CALLED TO DISCUSS SITUATIONS AND MAY BE ASKED TO COME GET THEIR CHILD DEPENDING ON THE SEVERITY OF THE OFFENSE.



FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

HOW ARE YOU GETTING TO CAMP?

Transportation will be by chartered bus. Please do not plan to drop off/pick up your student at camp unless there is a special circumstance. We cannot offer discounts if students don't ride the bus.

ARE MY KIDS GOING TO BE SAFE?

Of course they are! We have an incredible ratio of 1 adult leader to every 6-8 preteens. Our staff and leaders have been hand selected, background checked and trained to work with youth. We take safety seriously so you can rest at ease.

WHO WILL BE IN MY CHILD'S GROUP?

Groups are divided by grade and gender. Most grade/genders are made up of multiple groups (i.e. there are two 4th grade boys groups). For the most part, campers are grouped with kids and leaders they see each Sunday.

CAN YOU ACCOMMODATE FOOD ALLERGIES?

Yes! In the registration process, all of your preteen's allergies were collected, and we have communicated those allergies to the camp kitchen to accommodate those students who need it.

WILL MY CHILD GET ANY SLEEP?

Yes, but probably not as much as they would at home. Let's just put it this way - they'll probably be ready for bed early on Sunday!

PACKING LIST

- ***PLEASE LIMIT LUGGAGE TO ONE SMALL CARRY-ON SIZE SUITCASE OR DUFFLE BAG AND ONE SMALL BACKPACK OR DRAWSTRING BAG
- Bible + Pen
- Casual Clothes for 3 days (and maybe extra because they WILL get dirty!)
 - · Closed-toed comfortable shoes
 - Swimsuit (GUYS NO SPEEDOS, GIRLS NO 2 PIECE UNLESS YOU COVER WITH A LARGE DARK SHIRT)
 - Team Color swag
 - GLOW PARTY supplies (for Saturday night)
- Toiletries
 - Toothbrush / Toothpaste
 - Soap / Shampoo
 - Deodorant
- · Pool and Shower Towels
- Bedding and/or Sleeping Bag
- Pillow
- Reusable Water Bottle
- Sunscreen
- Extra Cash (MERCH AND SNACKS AT CAMP)
- Snacks (optional)
- Flashlight (optional)

WHAT NOT TO BRING

- No Drugs/alcohol (including vapes/e-cigarettes)
- · No Fireworks
- No Water balloons
- No Weapons (including pocket knives)
- No clothing advertising alcohol, tobacco, drugs or suggestive sayings
- No inappropriate clothing such as tube tops, halter tops, spaghetti straps, low cut tops or "short" shorts. If clothing is deemed inappropriate, campers will be required to change.

TEAM COLORS

TEAM COLORS ARE GREEN AND ORANGE AND ARE ASSIGNED AS FOLLOWS (reminder... all grade levels are for this upcoming school year):

- TEAM GREEN: 4th BOYS, 5th GIRLS, 6th BOYS
- TEAM ORANGE: 4th GIRLS, 5th BOYS, 6th GIRLS



CELL PHONES

We do not allow our preteens to carry their cell phones; in fact, for the benefit of all our campers, to alleviate distraction and to prevent damage, we will collect any and all phones/devises before departing for camp. If a camper does take a phone in their bag, we recommend them turning it in to their leader at camp. Our group leaders and staff will be able to be reached if families need to contact their kids.

MEDICATIONS

All medication MUST BE checked in to our staff at **PRE-CAMP CHECK IN ON JUNE 23**. This includes any over-the-counter medication and/or supplements. Medication will be dispensed by the camp nurse, and campers will not be allowed to keep any medication with them.

Here are the policies to keep in mind while packing your child's medications.

- Medication must be in the original prescribed container.
- Please pack only enough medication for your child's stay at camp. Any unused medication will be thrown away upon return to MISSON (unless otherwise requested by the parent during check-out).
- Medication must be in a medication envelope (provided at Bag Drop) labeled with your child's name and the correct dosage/directions for each medication.
- Should your child require over-the-counter medication, please be sure to write their name on the container or box and place it inside the envelope.
- Epi-pens and rescue inhalers will be checked-in, then returned to the camper's leader to keep for the week. These meds will be kept where youth can easily access them in an emergency.
